#### **MANAGER'S MINUTE**










#### WHAT IS THE THEME FOR VETERANS DAY 2025?

The theme for Veterans Day 2025 is "Service to Our Nation," as reflected in the poster design titled "Unified by Service" by Jeremy D. Carpenter, an Army veteran. The design visually brings together all uniformed services under one flag and purpose, emphasizing that service to the nation is a shared commitment across all branches and generations. The poster will be displayed at all VA facilities and military installations and will serve as the cover for the official Veterans Day National Observance program at Arlington National Cemetery beginning at 11:11 a.m. on November 11, 2025.

While several states have passed bills to observe daylight saving time year-round, or to eliminate it entirely, these state-level actions require federal approval to take effect. Until the Uniform Time Act is repealed or a new federal bill is passed by Congress, the U.S. will continue to observe the traditional time changes. The Sunshine Protection Act, which

would have made daylight saving time permanent, passed the Senate in 2022 but stalled in the House of Representatives.

**So, what will happen in 2025?** Clocks will continue to "fall back" by one hour on Sunday, November 2, 2025.

### BEFORE THE DAYS GET SHORTER, CHECK YOUR VEHICLE LIGHTS & WIPERS

Winter is quickly approaching and that means fewer hours of daylight. To be sure you can be seen by others and your visibility is not compromised, now is the time to check your vehicle's lights and wipers.

The chance of an accident increases if you can't see or be seen. From the driver's seat you may not notice a light that isn't working, so check all of your car's lights and replace those that are out. Also, be sure to inspect and replace wiper blades so you can see clearly when wet weather hits.

The wiper system keeps excessive water, dirt and snow, where applicable, from building up on the windshield, therefore maintaining clear visibility. Many factors can accelerate the replacement interval of wipers, including operating conditions (winter conditions can be tough on wiper blades), frequency of use, material and type of wipers and sunny weather. In fact, wiper blades can deteriorate faster and need more frequent replacement in sunny, southern states.

Lights are normal-wear items that require periodic inspection and replacement. The lighting system provides nighttime visibility, signals and alerts other drivers, and supplies light for viewing instruments and the vehicle's interior. In addition to replacing dimming, rapidly blinking and non-functioning lights, the following tips can help keep you safe:

- 1. If there is any doubt on whether or not your headlights should be on, turn them on. Lights not only help you see better in early twilight, they also make it easier for other drivers to see you.
- 2. Keep headlights, taillights and signal lights clean. External dirt and debris can dim operational lights from being seen by others.
- 3. Make sure that your headlights are properly aimed. Misaimed headlights blind other drivers and reduce your ability to see the road.
- 4. Don't overdrive your headlights. You should be able to stop inside the illuminated area, otherwise you are creating a blind crash area in front of your vehicle.
